Imagine you are sitting with your family at the dinner table and something reminds you of your mother, or father, or grandparents, and your heart melts with the memory of their faith inspiring life. Imagine you start telling a moving story, an incidence that you remember about them, to your family.

We want you to share such a story with Anṣār brothers. Majlis Anṣārullāh, USA is launching an initiative entitled "Stories of My Elders" to do just that. Please read below to get an idea of the scope of this project. We encourage all Anṣār, especially members of Ṣaff Awwal, to share with us the stories of their elders.

I personally urge my brothers in Saff Awwal to enlighten us with such stories. As an example, one such story of a member talking about his parents can be viewed at the following link:

The guidelines for story submission are as follows.

- Record a video of a Nāṣir telling a faith inspiring story of his deceased parents or family members.
- The Nāṣir should talk about a blood

- relative/family member.
- Show original artifacts or Tabarukāt (Tasbīḥ, Qur'ān, Prayer rug, notebook, letters, etc.) that helps us visualize. Use specifics when telling the story.
- Cell phone videos are acceptable provided there is clean background, steady hand, and good sound.
- The video must be under 6-minute duration.
- The story must be narrated in English or should have English subtitles.
- A Majlis could submit as many high quality videos as they like. A Majlis can earn up to a maximum of 100 points from these videos in a calendar year.
- Each video that meets the above criteria will be awarded up to 20 points maximum (from Şadr's discretion) towards 'Alam-i-In'āmī. Videos will be archived on our YouTube channel.
- The video with the most views on December 31, 2015 will be awarded the grand prize. The Nāṣir narrating the story and his Majlis will be recognized and awarded. The wining video will be shown at the 2016 National Ijtimā' of Majlis Anṣārullāh, USA.

Quick Facts about U.S. Population

Here are a few quick facts about U.S. population.

- As of 12/31/2014 U.S. population: 320,087,963
- 1 birth every 8 seconds
- 1 death every 13 seconds
- 1 international migrant (net) every 33 seconds
- Overall, male to female ration is virtually 1:1 (slightly more females)
- Per Capita income: \$28,155
- 14.5% of population lives in poverty (annual income of \$23,850 for a family of four)

The graphic on the next page (called Minaret Curve because it is shaped like a minaret) represents the population, as a percent of total population, of men and women. Men and women at age 40 represent 0.61% and 0.62% of the entire population, respectively. No surprise that the population declines precipitously after age 75. Did you notice that "bulge" from 50 to 65? That's the Baby Boom generation. And now you know why it is called that.


The following graph depicts the U.S. marriage trend from 1960 to 2014. Note that the percentage of those:

- currently married declined steadily from 1960 (72%) to 2014 (50%).
- that never married increased from 1960 (15%) to 2014 (24%)
- currently divorced or separated increased from 1960 (5%) to 2014 (11%)
- currently widowed declined from 1960 (9%) to 2014 (7%)
